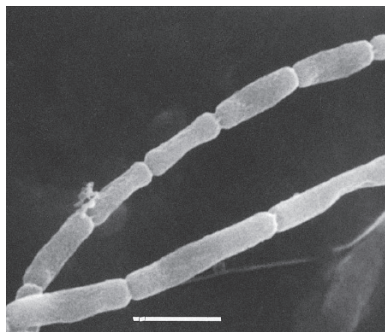


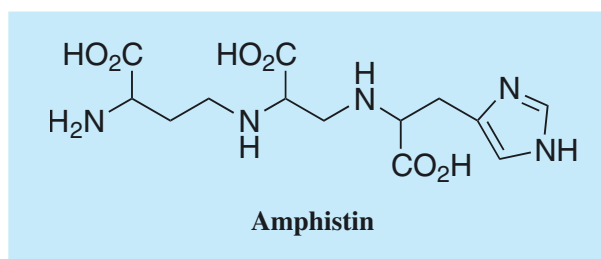
Amphistin

1. Discovery, producing organism and structure¹⁾

Amphistin was isolated from the culture broth of the actinomycete strain KP-3052 and identified as a melanogenesis inhibitor. It is a pseudotripeptide, γ -(β -histidinoalano) homo-alanine.

2. Physical data

White powder. C₁₃H₂₁N₅O₆; mol wt 343.34. Sol. in H₂O. Insol. in DMSO, acetone, CHCl₃.

3. Biological activity¹⁾

1) Inhibition of melanogenesis

Amphistin inhibited the melanogenesis of B16 melanoma cells at a concentration of 6.8 μ M, which is about ten times more potent than the melanogenesis inhibitor, arbutin. The IC₅₀ value of amphistin against the growth of B16 melanoma cells was 55 μ M.

2) Antimicrobial activity¹⁾

Amphistin weakly inhibited the growth of *Micrococcus luteus* PCI 1001, *Escherichia coli* NIHJ, *Pseudomonas aeruginosa* P3, and *Staphylococcus aureus* FDA 209P at a concentration of 10 μ g/disc.
